Ayala Klemperer-Markman is a lecturer at the Department of East Asian Studies in Tel-Aviv University. She obtained her Ph.D. (in the field of Japanese history; 2008) in The Hebrew University of Jerusalem. She carried out her Ph.D. research in Japan, focusing on feminist politics in Japan under its American occupation. She is interested in Japanese history, in Japanese feminism and in the history of Jews in East Asia.
